


#### Social structure

- Nobles served as government officials: Viziers, governors, tax collector.








## Middle class

- The middle class made up most of the wealth of Egypt. The marketplace was the usual place for numerous citizens.






### Lower class

- The lower class did the physical work














#### Ancient Egypt Religion
